I was reminded of a powerful sermon I heard last year during an ecumenical service in Swanley in which the preacher was horrified that ecumenical work is usually the 'Cinderella item' on Church Council agendas - overlooked, left until last, and certainly not a priority. He spoke profoundly about how [Jesus' prayer](https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=John%2017%3A20-26&version=NRSVUE) <https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=John%2017%3A20-26&version=NRSVUE> was that his followers 'may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you.' In other words, we are called to have the same kind of closeness with Christians of all denominations as God the Son has with the God the Father. A nod at the end of a Church Council meeting simply will not do!
