Message from Revd. Rosemary

Dear friends at Larkfield

Yesterday was my first ever Synod in this District. For those of you who may be newer in the life of the Methodist church, we belong to the Southeast District which includes Surrey, Sussex and part of Hampshire as well as Kent. Ministers and representatives meet twice a year and Ministers a third time, to renew the promises we made in ordination and have fellowship together. I had great joy spotting some old friends. two I trained with (Marie Anne who came to you in 1997 is another.) I also met a couple, both ministers, who'd served in the Circuit I candidate from, and have just moved to Canterbury in retirement. Belonging to one another in Christ is precious, and often Methodism enables this very well.

In the Synod we shared experiences of how much had changed post Covid. Many people feel that when history assesses this time, it will be labelled as a key turning point. Our Chair of District preached on John 3, as many of us did 2 weeks ago. His final sentence rang very true. 'Is this the time, he asked, 'when the church needs to be born again from above?'

I was particularly struck that this resonates with similar insights coming from other Christian writers and speakers. We are in fast changing times when so much is shifting. In order to model and present the good news of Jesus, church may need to take a very different shape. Challenges to us as individual disciples and as the body of Christ may be new and perplexing. A key message from the conference I went to three weeks ago was that we need to rely, not on human wisdom and effort but on God's Holy Spirit.

Synod ended, as it always does (!) with a treasured hymn by Charles Wesley 'Captain of Israel's host' I think I saw the second verse in a new light:

'By thine unerring Spirit led We shall not in the desert stray, We shall not full direction need, Nor miss our providential way. As far from danger as from fear, While love, almighty love is near.'


